019-0224 6.3 TOWN PLANNING REQUEST MINOR EXEMPTION #2401-001 – 12 PAIGE ROAD

The Head of Town Planning and Municipal Inspector presented the request:

#### Nature and effects of the request:

The request for a minor exemption is to be able to reduce the front setback to within 25 metres of the street, i.e. 21.51 metres, and the rear setback to 16.43 metres.

#### Identification of the site concerned:

The site to which this application relates is located on lot 5 192 9905 of the cadastre of Québec (registration number 8908-66-4148) located at 12 Paige Road in West Bolton in zone RES-1.

The floor was given to anyone who wanted to be heard.

**WHEREAS** the Planning Advisory Committee recommended in its resolution no. 0124-002 to grant the minor exemption on lot 5 192 905;

**WHEREAS** the proposed location complies with the provisions of *By-law No.* 268 Respecting Minor Exemptions ;

**WHEREAS** the proposed site would not be detrimental to the natural environments of the area as demonstrated in the environmental characterization provided by the applicant;

ROADS AND INFRASTRUCTURE AGREEMENT WITH THE MUNICIPALITY OF SAINT-ÉTIENNE-DE-BOLTON REGARDING THE MAINTENANCE OF THE ADJOINING SECTION OF SUMMIT ROAD

**WHEREAS** a one-kilometre section of Summit Road is abutting between West Bolton and Saint-Étienne-de-Bolton;

# AND RESOLVED:

**TO PROPOSE** a new agreement with the Municipality of Saint-Étienne-de-Bolton regarding the conditions for maintaining the one-kilometre-long section of road adjoining Summit Road for 2024;

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**TO AUTHORIZE** the mayor and the Director General to negotiate and sign any document to that effect for and on behalf of the Municipality of West Bolton.

9.1 ENVIRONMENT MODERNIZATION OF CURBSIDE RECYCLING – NOTICE OF INTENT TO ÉCO ENTREPRISE QUÉBEC REGARDING THE COLLECTION AND TRANSPORTATION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS FOR THE TERRITORY OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF WEST BOLTON FOR 2025

**CONSIDERING** the receipt of correspondence from Éco Entreprises Québec ("ÉEQ") by the Brome-Missisquoi RCM on January 23, 2024, and the publication of a decree on January 10, 2024, by the Government of Quebec;

**WHEREAS** the decree allows the municipal sector to honour, extend or renew beyond December 31, 2024, contracts in progress for the collection and transportation of recyclable materials, in order to comply with good practices in terms of launching public calls for tenders and thus collectively minimize the risks of service disruption and cost increases;

WHEREAS, in order to take advantage of this deadline, ÉEQ is asking the municipal sector to decide on its intention to exercise the option of extending its collection and transportation contracts for recyclable materials beyond December 31, 2024, so that the eligible costs related to collection and transportation services can be offset by ÉEQ as of January 1, 2025;

**WHEREAS** municipalities will have to reach a financial agreement with ÉEQ before March 14, 2024, in order to set out the applicable financial terms and conditions for the year 2025;

**WHEREAS** the Brome-Missisquoi RCM does not currently have any jurisdiction over recyclable materials and therefore the financial agreement with ÉEQ will have to be signed by the municipality of West Bolton;

**WHEREAS** that the regime for the modernisation of curbside recycling will enter into force on January 1, 2025;

IT WAS MOVED BY Gilles Asselin SECONDED BY Marie-Blanche Richer AND RESOLVED:

TO INDICATE to ÉEQ that the Municipality of West Bolton

- currently has jurisdiction over the collection, transportation and processing of residual materials;
- is under contract with the private company *Les Entreprises R. Cherrier inc.* for the collection and transportation of recyclable materials until December 31, 2024;
- intends to exercise its option for an additional year for 2025;
- wishes to reach a financial agreement with ÉEQ before March 14, 2024, so that all eligible expenses related to recyclable materials can be reimbursed as of January 1, 2025;
- authorizes the Brome-Missisquoi RCM to transmit on its behalf any document or data related to the modernization of curbside

**TO EXERCISE** the renewal option for 2025 provided for in call for tenders number 2023-11 concerning the collection and transportation of residual materials, conditional on the municipality reaching a financial agreement with Éco Entreprise Québec (ÉEQ);

**TO AUTHORIZE** the mayor and the Director General to issue any directives and sign any documents to that effect;

**TO FINANCE** these expenses, estimated at \$187,133.83, plus taxes and adjustments, from the Municipality's general account (2025 budget).
